

# Memorandum of Understanding

## ARTICLE I

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to establish a cooperative relationship between Lincoln University (LU), Missouri Department of Agriculture (MDA); Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC); Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR); University of Missouri-Columbia, College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources (UMC); Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED); and Missouri Aquaculture Association (MoAA) to facilitate development of an economically sound and environmentally responsible aquaculture industry in Missouri.

## ARTICLE II

Lincoln University is an 1890 land-grant, comprehensive institution which is a part of the Missouri state system of higher education. Founded in 1866 by the enlisted men and officers of the 62<sup>nd</sup> and 65<sup>th</sup> Colored Infantry, LU was designed to meet the educational and social needs of the freed African-Americans. LU Cooperative Extension serves Missourians through the dissemination and application of knowledge derived from research and practical experiences. LU Cooperative Research conducts basic and applied research with the goal of advancing knowledge and improving the quality of life for all people, with a focus on minorities, people with limited resources, and small farm families.

The Missouri Aquaculture Association was formed to represent and to promote the success of aquaculture in Missouri. The Association is dedicated to improving the quantity, quality, and efficiency of aquaculture production and promotes growth of the industry.

The Missouri Department of Agriculture is authorized under the provisions of RSMo 261.020 to establish cooperative relationships between agencies, public and private, which facilitate the production, processing, and marketing of agricultural products to assist in the development of economic, efficient, and coordinated services.

The Missouri Department of Conservation is authorized under the provisions of Article IV, Executive Department of the Constitution of the State of Missouri, subsections 40(a) through 46, to proclaim regulations which provide for the control, management, restoration, conservation, and regulation of the bird, fish, game, forestry, and all wildlife resources of the State.

The Missouri Department of Economic Development is authorized under RSMo 620.010 to provide all of the general provisions, definitions, and powers enumerated in section 1 of the Omnibus State Reorganization Act of 1974.

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources is authorized under the provisions of RSMo 640.010 with the administration of programs relating to the environmental control and the conservation and management of natural resources.

The University of Missouri-Columbia, College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources was established in 1870 as the State's land-grant university in response to the need for agricultural teaching and research in Missouri. Its major goals are the provision of relevant scientific knowledge and practice in its application to the food, life, and agricultural sciences.

### **ARTICLE III**

Parties to this understanding wish to enter into a cooperative agreement to facilitate the various particular interests under mutually-agreed objectives which serve the best interests of Missouri's aquaculture community and citizens through the establishment of the Missouri Aquaculture Coordinating Council.

### **ARTICLE IV**

Parties to this understanding wish to establish the following principles which shall serve as common guidance for conducting business through the venue of the Missouri Aquaculture Coordinating Council:

- To meet a minimum of biannually to discuss issues presented by the signatures to this understanding under a formal agenda procedure.
- To address agenda issues which have been submitted to the Recording Secretary of the Council who shall ensure distribution to all appropriate parties no later than fourteen (14) calendar days prior to a scheduled meeting of the Council.
- Appointees to the Council shall serve a term of four (4) years. Each subsequent nominee shall be selected by their respective institution.
- The parties to this understanding agree that the activities of the Council shall be limited to an advisory role and, as such, shall not infringe upon any statutory right or obligation of any signature to this understanding.
- The parties agree that the goals and objectives of the Council may be clearly defined through the establishment of a formal set of by-laws through which the Council shall function.
